We'd like to thank George Hook who went into the airplane business (clothespin type) and made all of the table decorations, and Laura Hook who once again did an excellent job taking care of the reservations. Also our thanks to all those who brought pictures and stock certificates relating to the Lawson factory, and to Bruce Szewczuga who ran into some snags in building a scale model of the plane which was built here in South Milwaukee in 1920-21. Each piece of the model had to be handmade and along with the cost the job proved to be more than expected so only half of the model was completed, but, it did give some idea of the magnitude of the plane. Bruce says the model will be finished and will be donated to the society to hang in the museum. Also Mr. Hardie says he will donate some extra material so we can set up a permanent display.

RUMMAGE SALE-- The Society will hold a rummage sale on Saturday, June 5th at the historical house. We need your rummage items, also craft and handwork donations, as well as plants and what have you-- The rummage sale continues to be our main method of fund raising, so we need all the help you can give.
