Member Rick Tangen, his wife Jan and children together with fellow Commander in Chief's Guard entertained and instructed visitors royally. We are hoping to be able to offer free to members of the S.M. Historical Society a candle light tour of the encampment of famed Revolutionary War group next year.

July 27th and 28th were the Side Walk Days spensored by the S.M. Chamber of Commerce. We Were assigned a booth at 10th and Milwaukee Ave. Each day we set up our display and table. The wind was a challenge on Friday morning but plates, buttons, notecards and book sales went well. We collected a little over \$240. for both days. Plate sales are up to \$644. at this time. Our cost is over \$20.00 a plate. The plate sells for \$25. which means our profit is less than \$5. per plate. The profit was-intended for display materials. (We can only order in lots of 72.) This 644 dollars is not a profit number. It is down payment for approximately 40 plates (some are paid in full)

SO WHY THE NEED FOR A FUND RAISER? In the past year or two the historical society house has experienced some water damage to the inside plaster ceilings. We have tried to find the causes of this damage and repair where necessary.

In the past two months we have had 5 roofers examine and give us advice and quotes on the repairs needed.

The repairs needed are 1. tuck pointing or replacing the mortar between the bricks of the chiminey, some bricks having no mortar; 2. New shingles, the old ones are hard and brittle and breaking off; 3. The valleys are covered with shingle material and are cracked; 4. The rain gutters were improperly placed and need to be redone; 5. About 5 to 6 feet of boards from the rain gutters upward are rotted on both sides of the house; 6. There are 2 layers of shingles on the house presently and must be removed according to city code and to replace the rotted boards.

We have tried to anticipate this repair and have saved \$2,000.00 but we find we need \$4,000.00. We have asked the city for an interest free loan of \$2,000.00 to be paid back in 3 years.

We will receive this loan in about a week, and the roof repair will be started in about 2 to 3 weeks.

Please be generous with your time for our fund raisers. Donations are extremely welcome.

We did not obtain a snow mobil trailer for a Memorial Day parade float this year. The parade was also rained out. Let's try again next year. It should be fun and good exposure for the Society.

No word from anyone on a log cabin for the Historical Soc. yard yet.

We did find a great button maker that we can borrow for minimum fee. Ready made buttons and make-your-own buttons were great sellers on the 4th of July.

Have you noticed the newly painted garage at the Society's House? The JC's and some of our members worked, painted and sweltered on July 14th while painting the SMHS garage in 95 degree heat. They did a great job!!!! Our thanks to Harvey Alexander for his expert advice and help with preparations. Helpers for food and refreshment were Gert Endthoff and Lois Schreiter. Painters were George Hook, Steve Schreiter, Dan, Lisa, and Jeanne Schreiter. Kathy Schreiter was the gofer girl.
