Our annual rummage sale held on Sept. 29th was a huge success. We had a good variety of thigs for sale this year, and a perfect day; so we were able to take in about \$230. The board recommended to the meeting of the society last month that the proceeds be given to Gert Endthoff as payment on the printing bill still owed to her on the "South Milwaukee-Then to Now" books. We have been whittling away at this obligation for some time now and it would please us all to finally clean up this debt. Gert has been very patient. At the meeting a motion to add \$70 more to the amount was made and seconded, and we were able to give her \$300.

Walter Siren and George Hook spent quite a few hours earlier this fall working around the Society house puttying windows, putting up storms, replacing broken windows and generally cleaning up around the premises. Tenant/caretaker Bruce Szewczuga put in the storm doors and straightened the flag pole after someone tried to bend it over. They didn't get the flag this time!

The Society sent a letter to the city requesting to be put on the budget for \$2,000 which would go towards painting or siding the exterior of the house. As of this printing no word has been received about the request. In spring a renewed effort will be made to try to have something done about making our museum more presentable. Any idea along this line would be appreciated.

ON NOVEMBER 15th members of the Society and Mayor Grobschmidt attended the formal unveiling of the Jagodzinski FDR collection at the GoldaMeir library of the UWM. Harry was a charter member of the society. He began his collection of Roosevelt memorabilia about 35 years ago and donated it to the university shortly before his death on July 31st. Those attending the dedication were Don and Rosemarie Broskowski, Barbara Mueller, DoraLee and Mayor Grobschmidt. Slide pictures were taken of the exhibit and Mrs. Jagodzinski and her daughter so they can be shown to society members at a future program.

A SHOW AND TELL program was held at the last society meeting. Some of the interesting items brought by members included a hand tailored suit jacket and vest from the early 1900's that was shown by Mr. & Mrs. Walter Siren. It is not often that we see mens clothing from the earlier years. Anne Slaaen brought a cut glass spoon holder which she incorporated in the evenings treat display and George H ook brought a telegraph key that was once used at the So. Milw. Depot. Richard Grobschmidt wasn't able to attend the meeting but he left a framed page of a 1876 book showing a plat of So. Milw. Lynn Rankin brought a photo of early Fowle relatives and told a little about them, and Otto Kuppert had some pics of early automobiles. Harold Hein brought several books about Lincoln which he donated to the Society. We already have a nice collection of Lincoln books thanks to Mr. Hein. program was interesting and most of those attending asked if we could do it again sometime. (We will)

Our historical society received some nice items recently thanks to the sleuthing of Irma Loeffler, president of the SM Women's She had recalled that the club had some old time clothing that was stored in various members attics and then finally donated to the Oak Creek historical society 7 or 8 years ago with the stipulation that if ever So. Milw. had a historical group it would be returned. Mrs. Loeffler looked through the minutes of the club until she found the entry. She then called Oak Creek and DoraLee and arranged a meeting. The original items were not clearly defined so Oak Creek showed some of their excess items and DoraLee selected those she thought our society could use. were: two hats; a lace collar; chiffon neck piece; a white dress c. 1910; a hand sewn blouse, c. 1900; maroon velvet dress c. 1920's; a black embroidered apron and a black velvet suit top, c. 1900. Thank you, Mrs. Loeffler, the Women's Club and Oak Creek Historical Society.
