

WELCOME TO THE 39TH ANNUAL NEIGHBORHOOD PARTY! ISN'T THAT GREAT!! WHAT A WAY TO CELEBRATE LIFE, FRIENDS AND THE PLACE WHERE YOU LIVE!!

STEVE AND I MOVED TO BROOKDALE DRIVE IN MARCH OF 1969. SOON AFTER MOVING IN WE WERE INVITED TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD PARTY; HOWEVER, BEING VERY BROKE AT THE TIME, WE DECLINED AND DECIDED TO PREPARE FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR. WE MET NEIGHBORS WE KNEW AND SOME WE DIDN'T KNOW. WE HAD A TERRIFIC TIME. THE SECOND YEAR WE ATTENDED WE WERE APPOINTED TO THE PLANNING COMMITTEE FOR THE PARTY TO BE HELD THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

THAT YEAR THE COMMITTEE (3 TO 4 COUPLES) MET AT NEIGHBORING HOME. THEY SELECTED A DATE, BRAINSTORMED A LIST OF POSSIBLE PLACES, CHOSE A PLACE, SELECTED A MENU, SELECTED A THEME FOR THE INVITATION, PLANNED TABLE DECORATIONS, ASSIGNED TASKS THE REST IS AND A TIME SCHEDULE. WITH THE NEW COMMITTEE'S HISTORY. APPOINTMENT GOES THE CARE OF THE RECORDS FROM PAST YEARS. THERE ARE TWO SCRAP BOOKS, 2 SMALL SPIRAL AND 1 SMALL BOUND NOTEBOOKS, PLUS AN 9 X 11 ENVELOPE WITH LETTERS, MENUS AND NOTES.

SOMETIMES THE INVITATIONS WERE HAND PRINTED AND DESIGNED BY RESIDENT ARTISTS DIANE RICHARDS AND BARBARA NIGGEMANN, SOME WERE TYPED. LAST YEAR AL AND ANNETTE LOPER USED A COMPUTER.

THE THEMES VARIED, SUCH AS, OLYMPIC, ELECTION, CARTOON, MYSTERY, THE 50'S, EVEN AN UGLY TIE CONTEST.

THIS YEAR'S THEME IS SPRING TIME.
THERE ARE 5 CHOICES ON THE MENU.
AVERAGE COST FOR EACH ABOUT \$16.00.
THE KITZKE'S AND MC CARRIER'S
HAVE THE HONOR OF BEING THE
COMMITTEE.

SOMETIMES THERE WAS LIVE MUSIC AND

DANCING. ONCE I REMEMBER RON WRIGHT DID A ICE SCULPTURE ABOUT 3 FEET TALL THAT WAS BEAUTIFUL ON THE APPETIZER TABLE.

FLORENCE WARD REMEMBERS MOVING INTO THE NEIGHBORHOOD IN 1955 AND THE LADIES OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD HAD STARTED THE SPECIAL ONCE A YEAR GATHERING ONE OR TWO YEARS BEFORE THAT. "IT WAS JUST THE LADIES MEETING FOR A FEW YEARS THEN THEY DECIDED TO INVITE THE HUSBANDS TOO."

THE NEIGHBORHOOD CONSISTED OF LAKE DRIVE, COLLEGE AVE, BROOKDALE DR. BROOKDALE CT., BADGER AND FAIRVIEW (UP TO ST. SYLVESTER'S).

THE FIRST NOTEBOOK LISTS THE
BEGINNING AS 1953. THE PARTY WAS
HELD AT "THE BROKERS", RACINE, ON
MAY 20, PRICE \$3.00, CHOICE OF
TURKEY OR BEEF. TWENTY-ONE LADIES
WERE PRESENT. GERANIUMS AND OTHER
FLOWERS WERE RAFFLED OFF AS DOOR
PRIZES. EVERYONE DONATED A 50 CENT
PRIZE TO USE FOR PRIZES WHEN THEY
PLAYED BUNCO. THE PAGE ENDS WITH
ANN RAEKE'S HAND WRITTEN "WE DID
SOME SINGING AND A GOOD TIME WAS
HAD BY ALL."

GRACE PENNINGTON, HER SISTER LOIS MEYERS, MARION STRAVINSKI AND EVELYN LINDE WERE AMONG THE FIRST GROUP OF WOMEN WHO ATTENDED. THEY ARE STILL ATTENDING. GRACE SAID "I LIKED ALL THE PARTIES. IT REALLY GIVES THE NEIGHBORHOOD A SENSE OF COMMUNITY. YOU GOT TO KNOW THE PEOPLE AND WHO THEY WERE EVEN IF YOU ONLY SAW THEM ONCE A YEAR."

THAT'S 39 YEARS OF HISTORY AND NEIGHBORLINESS, AND I'M PROUD TO BE A PART OF IT.
