MEMORIES of Living in South Milwaukee


It has been 24 years since we moved to South Milwaukee. We liked the neighborhood, not far from stores and schools. The lot was there on the northeast side of South Milwaukee and Nina Grobschmidt sold it to us from her brother Eugene's estate. builders were ready to start the basement of the house and the cement block trades people went on strike, leaving us with a grass lot from June to October. I remember visiting the partially built house often. The most memorable time was shoveling snow out of the front room window in January.

We wanted our 2 kids to see it being built. The thought was that they would adjust to living in a new place easier, but they still woke up at night for three months after we had moved into the new house.

We had two more children in the following years and now await the arrival of our first grandchild. Only one of the four remains at home. The older three are in three different states and there is nothing like being away from a place to help in appreciating it's uniqueness.

The neighbors have been great. When we needed help they were there. One night I had terrible stomach pains and had to go to the hospital. It was midnight and the kids were sleeping. At that moment my neighbor, a professional wrestler, was just coming home from a match in Green Bay and he stayed with the kids until my husband returned.

The land in South Milwaukee is slightly hilly, but mostly straight. It's good for riding bicycles to the store and to the library and then stopping for a Dairy Queen on the way home. The hills of Seattle are beautiful but

riding a bike there is difficult. I continue to enjoy the bike trails along Lake Michigan.

What is frozen custard? A lot of the world doesn't have any idea of our fantastic ice cream - frozen custard. Maybe you have enjoyed Dairy Queen or Jessica's or Leon's or Kopp's?

The South Milwaukee Library is still the best arranged library in the area. The childrens books are arranged with young reading levels in mind.

Skating on the mill pond in winter was always fun. The older sibblings would tease the younger ones on their two runner skates so they would be chased and show how much faster they could get away on their figure skates. In Southern California you have to go to the mountains for snow or ice.


Walking along the trails in Grant Park by the seven bridges was fun on Sunday mornings after church. Skipping stones on top of the water was hard and always presented a challenge.


