A TRIBUTE TO MAYOR CHET

South Milwaukee Mayor Chester W. Grobschmidt who recently ended a 37-year career with the city was paid tribute at a public ceremony attended by several hundred people.

The celebration marking Mayor Chet's retirement included plaques, citations, resolutions, special honors, and wonderful reminiscences by family and friends. And yes, even a few tears mingled with the outpouring of love and respect for the man who gave so much of himself to the city.

Chester W. Grobschmidt began his political career in 1957 when he was elected 4th District Alderman, a position he held through 1965. The following year he successfully ran for the office of mayor, continuously being re-elected for 28 years.

Mayor Chet has always been a strong supporter of the South Milwaukee Historical Society. In 1972 he was among the 66 Charter Members of the organization. In 1974, Mayor Grobschmidt and the Common Council granted official status to South Milwaukee's Bicentennial Committee, sponsored by the Historical Society. The 11-member committee was formed at a meeting of the Society. The following year, when South Milwaukee was recognized as an official Bicentennial City, an American Revolution Bicentennial Administration (ARBA) Flag was presented to the mayor to hold a place of honor until the end of 1976.

Mayor Chet worked with the Society to get the Grant Park Golf Clubhouse and Railroad Depot placed on the National Register of Historic Places. He also helped the Society obtain some funding for restoration and maintenance work on the Museum at 717 Milwaukee Avenue. Mayor Chet attended as many Society functions as his busy schedule permitted -- be it a state convention or potluck supper.

In February 1992, after receiving approval from the Common Council, Mayor Chet announced the appointment of Historical Society Museum Curator Gertrude Endthoff as the City of South Milwaukee's Official Historian. In July, he selected her Grand Marshall of the City's Heritage Days Parade. Mayor Chet also took it upon himself to order the red trolly car for the Society's open houses during the Bicentennial, and Heritage Days celebrations. The mayor also invited Society members to serve the cookies and refreshments at the annual Tree Lighting Ceremony held each December at City Hall.

As a special tribute to South Milwaukee's Mayor of 28 years, plans have been announced to name the Senior Center, and Oak Creek Pool after him. This will assure that the name Chester W. Grobschmidt will always remain an important part of our history for generations to come.

South Milwaukee Historical Society members will always remember the mayor for his unselfish dedication and loyalty to the organization.

Mayor Chet -- we wish you many happy, healthy years of retirement.
