LOIS & STEVE'S LABYRINTH ADVENTURE!

I love being in a garden. There is something wonderful about it to lift your spirit. Lois and I visited Janesville's Rotary Gardens, a 20 acre location with a variety of gardens. Madison has the Olbreich gardens. Milwaukee has Whitnall, Boerner Gardens and Mitchell Park Domes Gardens. West Bend has a labyrinth garden.

Lois and I drove to West Bend yesterday, to Regner Park in that city for an opportunity to view their "Natural Sculpture, A Labyrinth"

It is a 90-foot circle, bordered with a series of about 150 low shrubs, and consisting of concentric rings of flowers and grass paths, all of which lead to a center circle containing a small bench. None of the paths go all the way around the circle, rather they turn back much like a switchback road going up a mountain. One would think that each switchback would take you closer to the center but sometimes a 180-degree turn result in a path further from the center.

The attraction was built in 2005, with brick edging provided by a landscape contractor and a donor who provided the shrubs for the outside border. Today, volunteers plant and maintain the labyrinth in 15-foot segments, one or two volunteers to each segment. An underground sprinkling system waters the entire garden.

When we visited, in early September, late flowers and grasses still provided much color and contrast. The paths are grass, and were lush green, and some flowers still provided vibrant colors for our enjoyment.

Children who were visiting the labyrinth enjoyed running around the paths to see if they could reach the center quickly and jested with their parents who sometimes stepped over from one path to the next in an attempt to shorten the walk.

A brochure available at the site gives some of its history and invites volunteers to adopt a 15-foot segment. Also commemorative stones can be purchased and placed around the labyrinth as a fundraiser.

Researching labyrinths (note this is not the same as a maze, which has some dead end paths) reveals that a person beginning their walk to the center should dwell upon a problem in their life, and the labyrinth walk will help reveal solutions.
