### 2009 YEAR IN REVIEW.... REPRINTED FROM THE ANNUAL DINNER PROGRAM

He said he had salvaged it from some trash but that it was from the Smith Hospital and had been used to weigh the children born there. We asked how he could be sure and his answer was " I met a woman who was a nurse at the hospital and she looked at the scale and confirmed that it was genuine". He said he would try and contact the nurse but we have never heard further.

The Smith Hospital, named after Doctor Smith, its founder, was located at 1217 Milwaukee Ave. The 1953 South Milwaukee City Directory lists it as "South Milwaukee Hospital" Also listed is Dr. George O. Dempsey, physician, with offices at the same address.

The scale has a large pan (infant carrier) and tops out at 10 pounds, both of which appear to suggest it was used to weigh babies. Can anyone out there help us confirm it's provenance??
