

We went from this......to this!






We still have a lot of things to clear out but it's a start!

A little side note about Midwest Pottery:
According to an article by Gordon Lewis in
the 1950s, Midwest Pottery bought the gold in
bottles that cost \$23 each. It was painted on
in the form of brown varnish and the pieces
were sent back into the kiln where the varnish
burned off leaving the gold behind. At the
time, Midwest Pottery was producing 3000
pieces per day! One of the easiest ways to
recognize Midwest Pottery pieces is by the kiln
number on the bottom of the piece.
Keep your eyes open! We're always
on the look out for new additions.

April 30, 1863 Noon

Dear Car

I received your surdy letter yesterday and pardon the delay although I would not of I could do any other way.

The band are playing our moon so enade. I had no time yesterday to write for we gave up our longs tents and moved into our shelter tents. We were not sorry of the change for the small tents are healthfar than the large ones. We have built up beads take in them and two men get along very comformable in a tent.

Co. K is getting small as you say and a great many of them are going home, but the old and steady veterous are on hand for duty every time.

What is the reason Fred (Finds) has written to no one and let us book how he fased among the release. Today is the day appointed by Frendent Lincoln as a day of failing and projec and Gen Rosecrass Simed on order that is should be observed in the army of the Camberland.

We had supertion and muster in the morning and cleaning up the aid ground where the old zerts stood. These have sook the time until now and perhaps we shall have the rest of the day for rest. I guess I will go and see about driver.

## Afternoon


