### HOW TO MAKE A CAKE

From the Earl W Luther Elementary School cookbook, year unknown

- 1. Light oven; get out utensils and ingredients. Remove blocks and toys from table. Grease pan, crack nuts.
- 2. Measure 2 cups of flour; remove Johnny's hands from flour; wash flour off him, re-measure flour.
- 3. Put flour, baking powder and salt in sifter. Get dust pan and brush up pieces of bowl Johnny knocked o floor. Get another bowl. Answer phone.

- 5. Return to kitchen and find Johnny. Remove hands from bowl. Take up greased pan, find layers of nutshells in it. Head for Johnny who flees. knocking bowl off table. Wash kitchen floor, table, walls and dishes.


