The President's desk!

Spring is in the Air (Finally)...

I hope some of you had a chance to attend this year's South Milwaukee Historical Society joint program, hosted by the St. Francis Historical Society, on Thursday, April 11, with Carl Baehr, talking about the early history of the Irish in Milwaukee. As some of you may remember, last year's joint program, hosted by the Oak Creek Historical Society (with planning assistance from yours truly), was a chance to tour the Little Brick Church, with our host Fr. Patrick O'Loughlin, Pastor, at St. Matthew's Parish in Oak Creek. I do enjoy these joint programs with other local historical societies. These joint programs are a chance to meet some new people who enjoy local history in their community and the surrounding area.

Speaking of Spring, can the Summer Canopy Classes be that far off. Lois Schreiter has something for everyone this year, as she does every year. We'll be starting off the classes with Home Brewing, Everything you want to Know, followed by a talk on the Oak Creek Township (1840-1890), the South Milwaukee Railroad Depot, and ending with the 1860 Sinking of the Lady Elgin. I hope you'll have time to attend one, if not more of these talks.

Now that spring has arrived, along with an occasional April shower, who doesn't like to take a walk and discover something new in South Milwaukee. This year, my Spring Walk Historical Discovery was the Saint Haroutune Armenian Cemetery, at 1434 Rawson Avenue, that one enters though the parking lot of St. Mark's Episcopal Church.

Thanks to a little internet research, I was able to find out that Armenians started to arrive in South Milwaukee as early as 1910, to work at Bucyrus-Erie and other local factories, and grew to more than 300 families in the community. Until 1924, St. Mark's Episcopal Church was the site where visiting Armenian priests conducted liturgy. Then in 1924, Soorp Haroutune Armenian Apostolic Church was founded (the first Armenian church in Wisconsin), by purchasing the former St. Luke's Church at 909 Michigan Avenue. Until 1948, Armenian burials were done in St. Mark's Cemetery, by the cemetery's west side fence. Then in 1948, the Armenian community had purchased a plot of land adjacent to St. Mark's cemetery and founded the first Armenian cemetery

in the US: Saint Haroutune Armenian Cemetery. On February 7, 1960, a fire struck the Soorp Haroutune Church, destroying the altar. It was decided, by the membership, that a new church would be built. On April 15, 1962, the new Soorp Haroutune Church was consecrated, and in 1963, Holy Resurrection Church became the new name of the Soorp Haroutune Church.

For those of you who enjoy the rest of the story, it seems that there is no Armenian Saint Haroutune, because Haroutune means Resurrection in Armenian, and thus the Soorp Haroutune Church translates to Holy Resurrection Church!

When you have a chance, take a walk in South Milwaukee and discover some of our community's rich history. It's there for the exploring.
