Next up were Don Bulley & Nancy Wucherer with "The Mill Pond". Bad weather forced that class indoors. A couple of floor fans did their best to keep everyone from overheating (another hot humid day!) and the presentation went off without a hitch.



The final talk was "The Lawson Airliner" by Steve Schreiter. Weather forced us inside again but nobody seemed to mind. Steve did a great job and we all wished he would have talked longer but his wife, Society President Lois Schreiter, very strictly held him to half an hour!



Plans are currently under way for the Annual Lunch in February, 2017. The date isn't finalized yet but will be either the 11th or the 18th. We will definitely be moving to a larger venue and hope to have another great speaker. All the details will be in the winter newsletter.

In case you're wondering why the weather turned so cold last week...WE HAVE AIR CONDITIONING!! Uttke HVAC installed the units (one on the main floor, one on the second floor) on October 11 & 12.
