tickets and jumped out to move the barricades that blocked 11th avenue next to the depot. Surprising to all of us was the attendance. Despite the cold & snowy weather we had four tours, each filled the trolley to capacity with standing room only on the last tour! Trolley driver Dan only needed help on the first of the four trips. After that he had the route memorized. He told us that he was a driver for Gertrude Endthoff when she gave tours years ago and remembered some of her descriptions, especially the "Monkey Skunk" boat which was used to deliver lumber from the first sawmill. Special recognition went out to Tony G's Grant Park Garage. Not only did Tony make a substantial donation to help underwrite the cost of the trolley rental, back in the early 1900s his garage was known as the Yellowstone Trail Garage and was a popular stop for tourists who needed their vehicles serviced while travelling the Trail.

# **TIDS AND BITS**

If you drive down Milwaukee Avenue you can't help but notice how many of the businesses we grew up with are gone. Frank's Cycle Shop where you could rent a bicycle built for two; Richard's Shoe Store and that wonderful treasure chest you could hunt thru when you got a new pair of shoes! Grand Discount where you could go every winter to exchange your ice skates because you outgrew them; Segall's where you got a new gym suit every year; Acme Wall Paper Store; F. W. Woolworth's (later Drew's). Dretzka's Furniture Store? Fenger's Bakery & Sally's Candy Cupboard!! Sadly, not only are the businesses long gone but we aren't finding many records of them in our files so we're asking for your help. Does anyone have pictures of Milwaukee Avenue from the 1950s, 1960s, even the 1970s that you could share with the Society? What about other businesses from that era that are gone? All those corner grocery stores or the neighborhood bars. We have a fair number of promotional items from those places but it would be wonderful if we had pictures to go along with them. If you want to donate what you have that would be great but we can simply scan whatever you have to an electronic file and return the pictures immediately. History isn't just the things nobody still living remembers! History is alive and constantly evolving. Please help us preserve ALL our history. The Historical Society is looking for someone to come up with a design to use the pieces of tile that were saved when the "Continental Faience and Tile Company" office was torn down. The city has been storing them since they

were removed but they don't want to store them any longer and have offered them to the Society. The tile is quite special and needs to be preserved. There are about 10 pieces of floor tile, each

slightly less than 36 inches square, and about 6 inches thick with the concrete base attached, about 13 pieces of 8 inch square tiles of various lengths and about 4 pieces of wall tile, perhaps 2 to 2-1/2 feet



square with several inches of concrete on the back side. If you're the creative type who likes a challenge give Don Bulley a call. Just a reminder that all new Historical Society members are entitled to one hour of genealogical research from Steve Schreiter. If you haven't taken advantage of that yet give Steve a call.
