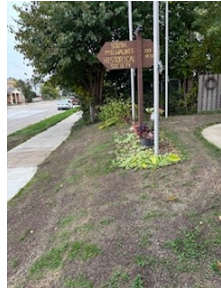

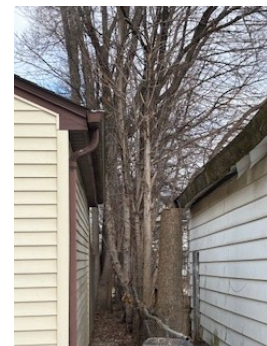
# Museum Updates

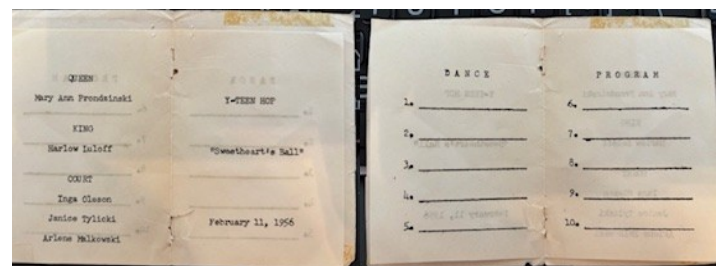
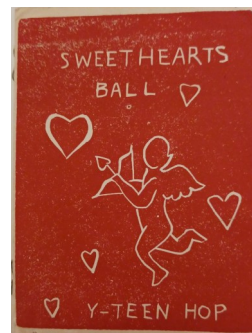
We have a new display at the museum showcasing shoe stores and shoe repair shops. Stay tuned for an exciting new addition to that display in Spring
