From The President's Pen—October, 2024

Hello everyone. Happy Fall, Halloween, and Thanksgiving! We hope you are enjoying the great weather.

I have some updates regarding your museum, none of which Is good news. We had our roof replaced due to the hail storm this spring. While removing the old roof (installed in 2021) we found out that the decking was not fully supporting the roof and would need to be completely replaced. That added to the cost of repairs to the tune of \$8,000 and which we did not budget for, nor would the insurance company cover. Added to that, the siding that was damaged in the storm will need to be replaced. However, the old aluminum siding is not manufactured anymore. The insurance will cover one half of the house (the north & west sides) but not the east or south sides. We will have to pay extra for those. That will add \$18,000 to the cost. We didn't expect this added expense either!

If that isn't enough, our annual inspection of the heating system found major repairs are needed to the boiler system (installed in 2002). That cost was \$1,500. Then we found out that the system had to be drained. Then, after that, the system was not heating several of the rooms. The new parts and labor added another \$1,400 to our bill.

Our reserve funds are being used up at an alarming rate! We need to come up with some way to raise the funds to pay for all of these needed repairs. I wish I had better news to report, but your 131 year old house needs a lot of "tender love and care". Hopefully we will find some way to meet these new and unexpected costs. We need your prayers & hopefully your help!

The Treasure Chest

1960ish --1982

As related to Mark S. Draeger by Richard and Lorraine Poplawski September 2022.

Anyone who went to "Richard's Shoe Store" when they were children up to teenagers remembers "The Treasure Chest" (aka The Toy Box)! It was a wood box with a cover and sides brightly stenciled in red with a pirate burying his loot on a deserted island. Once the cover was lifted, inside was a wonderland of small novelties and toys. If you were a lucky boy or girl, and your folks took you to "Richard's" for new shoes, you were allowed to pick out a toy with your purchase! How this exciting experience came to be didn't matter to me as a child, only what cool toy I would get when it wasn't my birthday or Christmas!

Richard Poplawski, proprietor, went to a shoe convention in the early 1960's to preview the new products, equipment, and trending shoe styles. Among the many vendors there, he met Larry Saunders, owner of "Larry Saunders Novelty Co.". Larry showed Richard the "Treasure Chest" and innumerable small novelties available to attract customers with children and teenagers. Well, the idea appealed to Richard, so he bought the "Treasure Chest" and placed his first order for the novelties. This turned out to be tremendously successful, so much so that the first box wore out! So he had to replace it with a new one in the 1970's!

An interesting true story happened when a lady came in with 2 young boys who had cried and made a fit because they didn't want shoes from Boston Store. They only wanted shoes from Richard's so that they would each get a toy!

BUT, the most popular novelty of all time with the High Schoolers, was the "Love Tester"! It was a type of liquid filled tube, like a thermometer. When you pressed your finger at the bottom of the tube, the liquid would rise and stop at one of the marks on the scale. Amazingly, every person was different! The scale read from bottom to top with "Frigid", "Cold", " Not Interested", "Luke Warm", "Maybe", and "Hot"! Both guys and gals loved it! After a while Richard was unable to get this item. Sales may have suffered!

Before the shoe store closed, a lady came in to relate a story about a "friend" of hers that collected every type of toy from the "Treasure Chest". Now that's a serious collector (with a pretty big shoe collection too)!

"Richard's Shoe Store" was in business from 1953 through November 1982 when big-box stores were putting small town stores out of business. During that last November, many people came in and asked, "Where are we going to get our shoes now"? (Inferring also their kids' toys)!

Every place Richard and Lorraine moved, the "Treasure Chest" went with them. Their daughter Laurie proudly displays it in her home today! Richard and Lorraine are now retired and living in Regency Senior Complex, New Berlin, WI.

We also had them light up some of the display cabinets making it much easier to view the artifacts inside.






FAMOUS RECIPES

A recent acquisition, copyrighted in 1930. From the forward:


